

Adventure Project: Book Jacket

For this project you will create a new book jacket (larger than an actual book jacket size--12"x10" is a **suggested** size for the front and back) with an **original** cover design and a five paragraph summary of the book on the back. One interior flap should have the theme writing and the other should have EITHER a perspective analysis or a short author (the author of the book--not the student) biography.

Story Summary (5 paragraph and follows outline)	A summary is present but difficult to understand due to lack of organization and/or amount of information included. Journal entry is in first person, in the character's voice and is a thoughtful reflection about how the character feels about the adventure after completing it.	Journal entry is in first person, in the character's voice and is a thoughtful reflection that clearly shows how the character feels about the adventure after completing it. It includes at least three examples of figurative language (simile, metaphor, etc.) to help the reader connect to the character.

Book Jacket is appropriate size to have detail. (approximately 10" x 12") **Johnny has the materials, if needed.</p>	<p>Each piece is complete, accurate and interesting to read (summary on back, perspective analysis on one flap, theme on the other flap and original cover design, title, author name and your name on the front).
