

Adventure Project: Quilt

For this project you will make quilt squares from paper, felt or other materials. Stitch or otherwise attach the squares together to form a quilt. There needs to be at least one square for the theme of your story and a five paragraph summary (can be split among several squares). AT LEAST four other squares should show characters, scenes, or symbols from the book.

Story Summary (5 paragraph and follows outline)	A summary is present but difficult to understand due to lack of organization and/or amount of information included. It also has a strong writer's voice and is interesting to read. There are varied sentence structures and meaningful vocabulary.
Theme (minimum 1 paragraph)	A theme is identified, but it is not clear, lacks detail and/or is not significant to the story.	A relevant theme is identified and supported with evidence from the book.	A significant theme is identified, supported with evidence from the book and connected to another book or a place.
Extra Squares	There are only 1-2 squares besides the theme and summary OR the additional squares are unclear or sloppy.	There at least 4 squares besides the theme and summary. These squares clearly show specific scenes, characters or symbols from the book.	All extra squares have significant ties to the book. These squares are neat, attractive and detail specific scenes, characters or symbols from the book.
Quilt Construction	Quilt is not sturdy enough to be folded and transported. It may look like a poster rather than quilt.	Quilt is sturdy, can be folded and is neat. It is clear that it is meant to represent a quilt. <u>Suggested</u> size: 12 1' squares	Quilt is sturdy, can be folded and is neat. Interesting materials were used and there was some kind of sewing (even if on paper) It is clear that it is meant to represent a quilt.

Polished Work	There are many spelling, grammar and/or punctuation errors. The work may be messy.	There are few (less than 5%) spelling, grammar and/or punctuation errors. The work is tidy.	There are rare (less than 2%) spelling, grammar and/or punctuation errors. The work is neat and interesting to look at.
<u>BONUS ITEM--Optional</u> Perspective Analysis a one paragraph (or more) journal entry from your main character	Journal entry is incomplete, not in first person and/or does not give a thoughtful reflection about how the character feels about the adventure after completing it.	Journal entry is in first person, in the character's voice and is a thoughtful reflection about how the character feels about the adventure after completing it.	Journal entry is in first person, in the character's voice and is a thoughtful reflection that clearly shows how the character feels about the adventure after completing it. It includes at least three examples of figurative language (simile, metaphor, etc.) to help the reader connect to the character.
